Four-point provincial proficiency scale

The **four-point provincial proficiency scale** is used in K-9 to communicate student progress in all areas of learning. The four points on the scale include Emerging, Developing, Proficient, and Extending.

Effective communication with parents and students

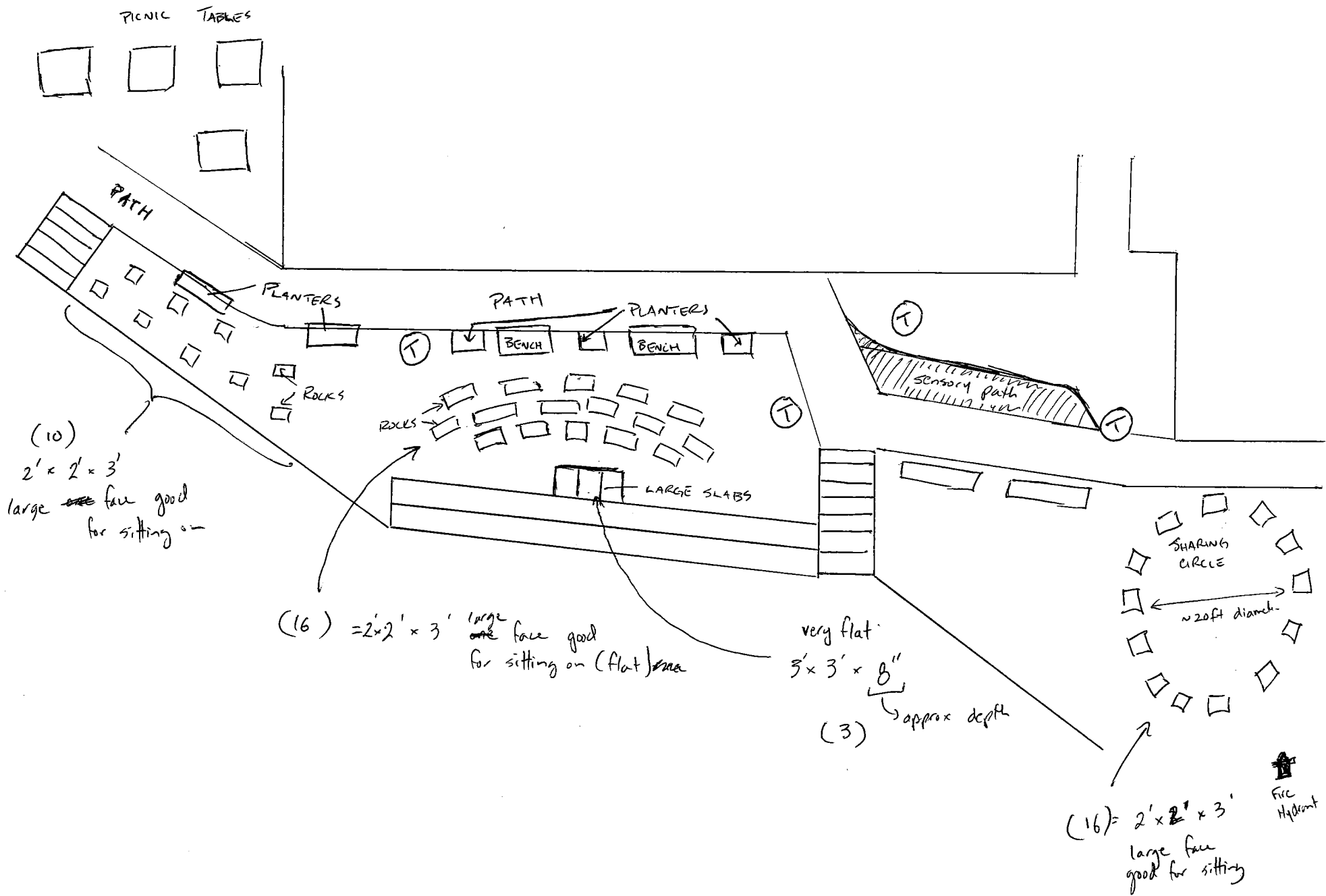
Effective and frequent communication about student progress between home and school is central to student success. The goal of communicating student learning and progress is to ensure that:

- ➔ students are engaged in meaningful conversations that extend their learning and progress
- ➔ parents are well informed about their child's progress
- ➔ parents are involved as partners in a dialogue about their child's progress and the best ways to support and extend learning



The DRAFT K-9 Student Reporting Policy (2019) at a glance

Frequency of reports	A minimum of five communications of student progress: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a minimum of four points of progress during the year • one end-of-year (or end-of-semester) summary of progress
Proficiency scales	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The four-point provincial proficiency scale will be used to communicate progress in each area of learning in K-9. • In Grades 4-9, letter grades are provided to parents on request. (See section 6 for a draft proficiency scale/letter grade comparison table.)
Student self-assessment of Core Competencies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parents will be provided with student-selected evidence of and reflection on Core Competency (Communication, Thinking, and Personal and Social) development at least once during the school year. • Students will also complete a self-assessment of the Core Competencies at the end of the year, with the support and guidance of the teacher when needed or appropriate.
