Learning Updates (aka Report Cards). Over the past 5+ years, teachers across Central Okanagan Public Schools have been exploring alternate, more timely, and more meaningful ways to communicate student learning to families. The DRE school community saw a new learning update (report card) just last school year. Recently, the BC Ministry of Education released a new K - 12 Student Reporting Order. The order calls for a more consistent and aligned approach to report on student learning across schools. For DRE, this means a similar but different looking report card for the upcoming school year.

- The frequency of the reports will remain the same
- The strengths-based language (emerging, developing, proficient, and extending) will remain the same
- The description of student progress will be more clear and concise
- The DRE report card will look very much like the report cards from OTS, PGE, HMS, and GESS

More information will be available to families in the coming weeks. The first term report card goes home on December 14.

Student Affordability Fund - School Fees and Field Trips. The school district has completed its consultation process to find ways to offset direct costs that families experience as part of their children participating in school. Thank you to all families for their patience while awaiting the results. The district will look at assisting elementary schools in reducing the costs of field trips

for families. Not all details are available, and more information will be provided to families as it becomes available.

The collection of school supply fees will resume. Families will receive a notification for how to pay their school fees using <u>Schools Cash Online</u>. Thank you to those families who paid school fees before <u>School Cash Online</u>. Thanks again for your patience and understanding while the school district held its consultation process.

Grade 5 Year End Trip. On November 2, before the PAC meeting, there will be a grade 5 parent meeting in regards to the year end trip. Details will be provided to families about providing students with a two-night trip to the Eagle Bay Camp outside of Blind Bay. Details such as cost, parent volunteer opportunities, and fundraising will be shared with families.

Davidson Road Parking Lot and Road Traffic Update. The school has received several questions about the school parking lot and Davidson Road traffic flow and congestion.

- To help improve flow and reduce congestion in the Kiss and Drop area during the morning, Rob and Jen have been helping with opening doors and directing vehicles in this area. After school, Mrs. Reynolds and Mrs. Ross has been helping pedestrians safely cross the Kiss and Drop lane. Mr. and Mrs. Prescott are looking at training their grade 4 students to help out with the Kiss and Drop area in the morning. More information to follow.
- The bylaw office of the District of Lake Country was contacted to inquire about why cars
 were allowed to park in the bike lane. The District said that cars have an exemption to
 park in this area during school opening and closing times. The bylaw officer also
 mentioned that this issue has been ongoing for about the last 25 years and numerous
 solutions have been attempted. The bylaw officer also mentioned that the current
 solution seems to work best.
- The Lake Country RCMP was contacted to see if they had any suggestions to improve traffic congestion. The liaison officer agreed with bylaw that the issue has been ongoing and that the current situation is the least problematic.
