- Early Learning for Families (ELFF)- Tuesday, January 31,2017. Runs from 5:30pm-7:00pm. It is a program for children 3-5 years old. Also, if anyone can help make Chili, cook the meat, help make salads, or has crock pots or warming dishes that would be helpful. Volunteers needed for set up and clean up.
