- 6. Reminder Specialty Academy fee changes (typically at middle and high school) require PAC approval and this should always come to a PAC general meeting for presentation, discussion and vote. From the BC SCHOOL ACT see section (6) below:

Specialty academies

82.1 (1) In this section, "specialty academy" means an educational program that emphasizes a particular sport, activity or subject area and meets the prescribed criteria set out in the regulations.

(2) A board may offer a specialty academy if

- (a) the board has consulted with the parents' advisory council for the school where the board proposes to offer the specialty academy, and
 - (b) the board is of the opinion that there is sufficient demand for the specialty academy.
- (3) A board that offers a specialty academy must
 - (a) make available sufficient instruction for students enrolled in the specialty academy to meet the general requirements for graduation, and
 - (b) continue to offer a standard educational program in the school district.
- (4) Despite section 82, but subject to section 82.4, a board may charge a student enrolled in a specialty academy fees relating to the direct costs incurred by the board in providing the specialty academy that are in addition to the costs of providing a standard educational program.
- (5) On or before July 1 of each school year, a board that offers a specialty academy must
 - (a) establish a schedule of fees to be charged under subsection (4), and
 - (b) make the schedule of fees available to the public.
- (6) Before establishing a schedule of fees under subsection (5), a board must
- (a) consult with the parents' advisory council for the school where the specialty academy is offered, and
 - (b) obtain the approval of that parents' advisory council for the schedule of fees

Children who turn five years old before December 31, 2025 are eligible to attend kindergarten in September 2025. Registration opens for September 2025 on Monday, February 3, 2025 at 7:00 am. Families are encouraged to visit the enrollment page on the Central Okanagan Public Schools website (https://www.sd23.bc.ca/school-enrollment) prior to February 3rd to learn more about the registration process. If your child already attends Davidson Road, or is transitioning to HS Grenda, please do not complete a new registration. Current Davidson Road students are automatically transitioned to the next grade (or middle school).

Student Learning Conferences

DRE will host the second student learning conferences of the school year on Thursday,
 February 6th and Friday February 7th. Both days will be early dismissal days with classes
 ending at 12:30pm. Buses will be running at the adjusted time. Teachers will determine
 the format of these conferences for their individual classes, and it may include both

Middle-Years Development Instrument (MDI)

• The MDI is a research project led by UBC in Vancouver. It is dedicated to improving the health and wellbeing of children. A part of the research project is an anonymous survey which gives students a voice to report about their well being as well as the assets in their lives which help them cope with adversity. The results of the MDI can be shared back to the school's staff, students, and parents. PACs tend to appreciate the MDI

because they hear directly from their children about how they are doing. PACs can then target organized activities and funding based on the results of the MDI. This year, our district is having all grade 5 students complete the MDI. Davidson Road grade 5 students will complete the survey in late January/early February.

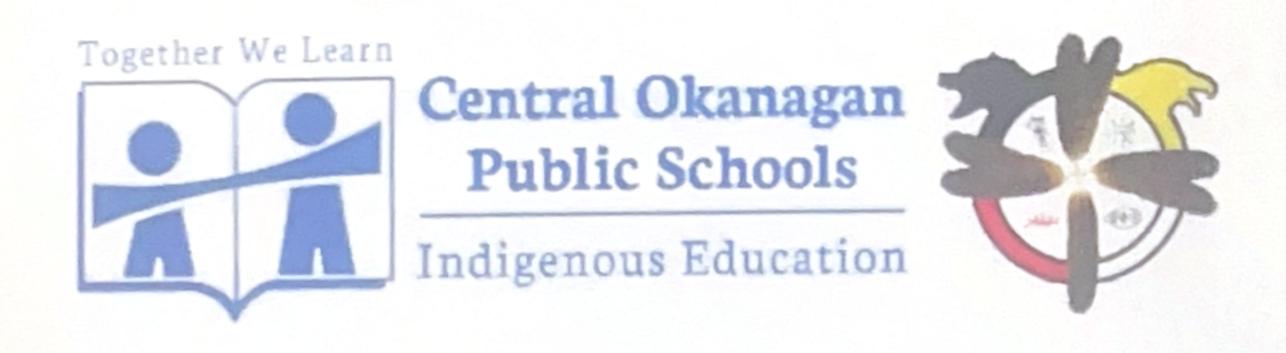
