Trustees Update - Chantelle Desrosiers

- -Conversations have been focusing on school catchment reviews for Mission family of schools and Westside of Schools.
- -SD Committee Planning & Facilities meetings are meeting on January 5^{th} & 17^{th} to discuss school needs
- -January 26th recommendations will be made to the board
- -No funding has been approved for secondary school on Westside yet. If funding is not approved, George Pringle Elementary will remain open as an elementary school until funding has been provided.
- -Would welcome any support from families, PACs, COPAC in form of letters to government agencies to outline the needs for additional school spaces in our district.
- -Valary Chidwick, part of Central zone family of schools has not seen any survey emails, so does not feel informed of the process.
