Learning Updates (Report Card). The school district has started the draft implementation of the Ministry K-9 Reporting Order. The term 1 learning update was the first phase. All teachers at DRE are participating in the implementation. The term 2 learning update goes home on March 15.

Middle-Years Development Instrument (MDI). The MDI is a research project led by UBC in Vancouver. It is dedicated to improving the health and wellbeing of children. A part of the research project is an anonymous survey which gives students a voice to report about their well being as well as the assets in their lives which help them cope with adversity (like a pandemic). The results of the MDI can be shared back to the school's staff, students, and parents. PACs tend to appreciate the MDI because they hear directly from their children about how they are doing. PACs can then target organized activities and funding based on the results of the MDI. This year, our district is having all grade 5 students complete the MDI. Davidson Road grade 5 students will complete the survey in late January/early February.

John Morrone - Principal E-School SD23 – Provided an overview of e-school opportunities for online learners as well as traditional "brick and mortar" school students.

- Students seeking eSchool23 learning opportunities are generally requiring flexibility with...
- a. supplementing school schedules
- b. catch up for graduation requirements
- c. accommodating other commitments (i.e. sports)
- d. hybrid options
- e. prefer learning at home
- f. travelers
- g. medical needs
- h. mental health concerns (i.e. anxiety)
- eSchool23 authorized by Ministry of Education & Child Care (MECC) to offer students and families a classroom alternative through online learning
- Supports K-G12 students including graduation and adult learners
- Home schooling NOT synonymous with Online Learning. Home schooling □ no oversight of educational programs by certified educators & does not meet Dogwood Graduation Certificate versus Online Learning □ fully accredited, follows BC curriculum and meets Dogwood Graduation Certificate
- K-9 Virtual School Program synchronous program with virtual classes with teachers & peers via Zoom; offers various activities like robotics, coding, etc.
- Middle School Transitions Program school referral program; partnership program with district middle schools; creation of one off programs customized to meet student's specific learning and sporting needs and/or "on the border" for not being able to attend traditional school for a variety of reasons.
- 10-12 Self-Paced Program Course for full time or part time students including adults; offers hybrid programs
- Canadian Sport School Program partnership program with PacificSport Okanagan; specialized multi-sport program for students; half time spent in traditional brick and mortar school and then other half of time transition over to physical learning, sport training
- Currently e-school provides 3 indigenous course credits with more coming this school year.
 Guest Speaker
- Effective July 1, 2023, eSchool23 programs will only be available to students who ordinarily reside within the Central Okanagan Public Schools' catchment boundary
