1) **Motion:** to change the COPAC Bylaws as follows:

That: The Members of COPAC amend the COPAC Bylaws of December 3, 2012 by adding the phrase "of the members present," after "The members may, by a majority vote of not less than two thirds (2/3)" in COPAC Bylaw Section X – CONSTITUTION AND BYLAW AMENDMENTS.

The revised section will read:

The members may, by a majority vote of not less than two thirds (2/3) **of the members present**, amend the Constitution and Bylaws. Written Notice specifying the proposed amendments must be given to the members not less than 14 days before the meeting at which the vote will be taken.

2) Motion: to change the COPAC Bylaws as follows:

That: The Members of COPAC amend the COPAC Bylaws of December 3, 2012 by deleting Section I – Membership, Voting Members (subsection) 2.

2. COPAC will pay the annual BCCPAC Membership fees for each PAC upon receipt of a completed copy of the BCCPAC Membership Registration form. It is the responsibility of each member PAC to complete and submit the BCCPAC membership form to the COPAC Secretary at least 2 weeks before the deadline indicated by BCCPAC.
